Shack managers report September 2021

As I am still unable to join via Skype, so here is a brief report from what I am aware of since my last report:

The covid restrictions continue within HMS COLLINGWOOD (CWD), restricting access to the HQ to all but CWD pass holders and service personnel (Members).

Regular checks on the shack and its fixtures have continued throughout the restrictions. Equipments have been powered up though not Transmitted on. Ian (service member) and a team have undertaken some crucial maintenance, spray coating the repaired mast, re affixing the earth cable, removing the damaged winch and re soldering some internal coax connections.

Some work remains outstanding including replacing the winch mechanism. I would like to pass on thanks to Ian and his team for the good work they have done.

The radio bays will still need some final attention prior to them being used, they need to be connected ready for use I.e connected to an appropriate

power supply and the correct antenna with clear signage for the operator to read stating the setup of that particular bay.

I would also suggest due vigilance on returning and operating equipment as it has been a while since operators have used items in the shack, please take time to acquaint yourself with the equipment, connections and safe operating procedures. If in doubt ask and please leave the equipment connected as found for other users to enjoy.

On a sad note the Radio Museum which has been in CWD for many years has now completely gone, the building is now empty right down to the last desk and shelf. The care takers / custodians had meticulously looked after the exhibits there for many years. It would appear the items have moved to various stowage locations away from CWD, no plans as yet to display any of them.
